NL NDP Surges to Tie PCs in Voter Support

HALIFAX: Overall satisfaction with the performance of the provincial PC government declined this quarter, according to the most recent survey conducted by **Corporate Research Associates Inc.** Currently, under one-half (45%, down from 58% three months ago) of residents are either completely or mostly satisfied with the performance of the PC government. Meanwhile, over one-half (52%, up from 37%) are dissatisfied with the performance of the current government, while three percent do not offer a definite opinion (compared with 4%).

Support for the governing Progressive Conservative Party declined, with four in ten decided voters backing the PCs (38%, down from 46% in November 2012), which is tied with support for the NDP (39%, up from 31%). Support for the Liberals is stable at 22 percent (compared with 23%), while less than one percent prefer the Green Party (unchanged). One-quarter are undecided, do not plan to vote, or did not state a preference (26%, compared with 27%).

PC Leader Kathy Dunderdale's personal popularity also declined this quarter (32%, compared with 36% three months ago), while one-third prefer Lorraine Michael of the NDP as Premier of the province (33%, compared with 29%). Support for interim leader Dwight Ball of the Liberal Party rests at 17 percent (compared with 18%), while under two in ten like none of these leaders or have no definite opinion at this time (18%, compared with 16%).

These results are part of the **CRA** *Atlantic Quarterly*[®], an independent survey of Atlantic Canadians, and are based on a sample of 400 adult Newfoundland and Labrador residents. The survey was conducted from February 11 to March 8, 2013 with overall results for the province accurate to within \pm 4.9 percentage points in 95 out of 100 samples.
