PEI Liberals Maintain Lead Although Islanders Uncertain about Performance of Current Government

HALIFAX: Despite a leadership change, the PEI Liberal Party has maintained its lead although more residents are uncertain regarding the performance of the current provincial government, according to the most recent survey conducted by Corporate Research Associates Inc. Approximately six in ten decided voters support the Liberals this quarter (58%, compared with 50% in November 2014), while backing for the PCs stands at 26 percent (compared with 23%). Support for the NDP stands at 12 percent (compared with 15%), while support for the Green Party rests at four percent (down from 11%). The number of Islanders who are undecided rests at 32 percent (compared with 26%), while seven percent refuse to state a preference (compared with 5%), and two percent either support none of the parties or do not plan to vote (compared with 4%).

With regards to government satisfaction, over four in ten PEI residents (44%, down from 54% three months ago) are satisfied, while three in ten (30%, down from 39%) are dissatisfied. The number of residents who do not offer a definite opinion has risen and stands at one-quarter (26%, up from 8% three months ago).

Four in ten PEI resident offer their support for newly designated Premier Wade MacLauchlan this quarter (42%, compared with 41% in November; former Premier Ghiz announced his resignation on November 13th, 2014). Meanwhile, prior to Rob Lantz being elected as the new leader of the PEI PC Party on February 28th, 2015, one in ten Islanders (10%, compared with 13%) preferred Interim Leader Steven Myers of the PC Party, while one in seven (14%, compared with 17%) backed Mike Redmond of the NDP. Support for Peter Bevan-Baker of the Green Party stood at five percent (unchanged). Under one in ten (6%, compared with 10%) preferred none of these leaders, while one in seven (23%, up from 14%) were undecided or did not offer an opinion.

These results are part of the CRA Atlantic Quarterly[®], an independent telephone survey of Atlantic Canadians, and are based on a sample of 300 adult Prince Edward Islanders, conducted from February 9 to February 28, 2015 with overall results accurate to within \pm 5.7 percentage points, 95 out of 100 times.
